## Manager's Minutes

I've decided that someone at the club must have wronged Mother Nature somewhere along the way. The weather here for the past several months has been all but impossible. As I write today, we should have been golfing for over a week now, but instead, we received two more inches of snow yesterday and the forecast isn't much prettier, at least from a golfer's point of view. I hope things will have turned for the better by the time you receive this anyway.

I do want to comment about the work that Consumer's Power recently completed in trimming trees from their electrical easement. The tree trimming is not aesthetically pleasing by any means, but I think we all understand the necessity. That said, the reason I mention it is that the logs left behind are not always on club property. Please contact the appropriate property owner for permission, before removing any of them. This is not necessary for club property as we consider it dead or down and free for the taking (by members). If you're not sure, please ask.

One other item of note I'd like to mention is the addition of a bar in the dining room (at the south end, if you can picture it...photos will follow when complete). The bar is being

added to provide better bar service and more efficiency to the food and beverage operation. It's not intended to be a bar that patrons visit exclusively, more of a place to enjoy company of your family and friends while you wait for your table. One side benefit that it will provide is the ability to offer a bar EVERY weekend during the summer. In the past, the ability was hampered by rental of the lower level for private events such as weddings. Once this bar is complete, if the Lost Lure Lounge is unavailable for any reason, we should be able to still have bar service, albeit moved to the dining room. I know changes are hard to live with sometimes, but please give this one a chance.

In closing, the new season is upon us and as always it seems like there is more to be done than we have time or manpower to accomplish. 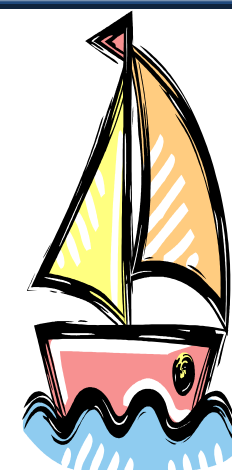

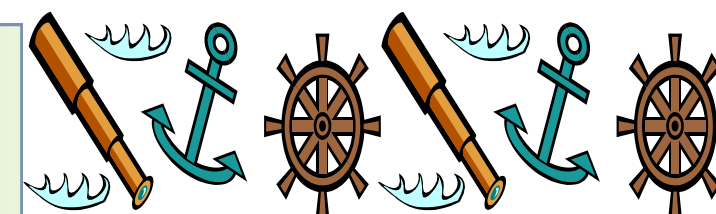

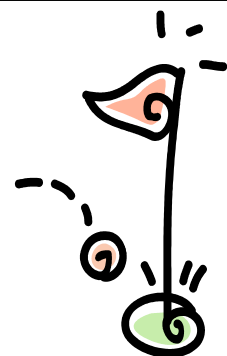

# Presidents POV (Point of View)

### “Self-government won’t work without self-discipline”

The great Paul Harvey first said that way back in 1978 and repeated it often over the years. It pertains to our own little “town” of Lost Lake Woods Club, just as much as it does to any municipality in our great country.

We have nearly 1100 memberships in our club but I don’t have a clue the actual number of “members”. With all the spouses and children, I wouldn’t be surprised if we surpassed 3500 or closed in on 4000 members in our community, maybe even more than that. The point is, we have a small but respectable sized community, and without self-discipline, self-governing our private community would be impossible, and LLWC would not be a pleasant place.

From way back in 1926 the founders of LLWC put together the bylaws that govern how we operate, maintain, and fund, our club but they also put together a written set of rules that we must abide by. These rules are in place primarily to maintain fairness and most importantly safety in our club, and they have been modified, added to, and eliminated from time to time, based on the best interests of the membership.

As you are aware, we have our own mobile security team that helps enforce the rules, and if necessary, to report the rule infractions to Management and the Board of Directors. It is a difficult position for our security team to be in, as they understand that most people they will encounter are here on vacation and trying to enjoy their precious time away from work and the daily strains of life. The last thing anyone wants, including the security team, is for a member to have an encounter with security.

Most times the incident with security will result in just a warning and review of the rule infraction but occasionally the infraction is severe enough that a report is written and passed on to Management, and eventually to the Board of Directors, for review and possible action.

This is one of several reasons the Board will meet in “Executive Session” during our monthly Board meetings. Along with rule infractions the Board will use the executive session to discuss such things as sensitive employee issues, member financial issues, and any pending litigation (if any). These rule infractions are discussed during the Executive Session, so that if a member is asked to attend, the issue can be discussed and reviewed without any undue embarrassment or pressure of having to speak about it in a public forum.

But I believe that because these issues are handled in a private setting, we have some members that believe nothing ever happens to people that break the rules. I have been told many times that “nothing ever happens” to people that break rules. That’s far from the truth.

But before the Board can take any action, the incident must be reported. On many occasions when an issue involving rules or discipline are discussed during an open session of the meeting, or just in speaking with fellow members outside of a meeting, I’ve had members say to me “I’ve see people do that all the time” or maybe it’s “ Oh, people do that often and nobody does anything”. When I hear that I always ask “did you say anything to that member or report it to security?” Most times, the response is “no”. Then I ask why and I get a number of lame excuses.

Security cannot be everywhere at all times. And we all know that up until the recent dues increase, security had to be cut deep. I’m hoping that by the time you read this article, some measure of security has been restored. But even then, security still cannot watch everything, all the time.

It is up to us, the members of LLWC, to help our fellow members enjoy the club in a safe and responsible way. If you encounter a member that is doing something wrong, ask them about it. Maybe they are not aware of that rule and only need to understand that what they are doing is not allowed. If it’s serious enough or you don’t want to or can’t say anything directly to the member, please report it. The report can be made anonymously. If security and the Board are not aware of an incident, nothing can or will be done. And that could result in someone getting hurt.

I would encourage members to read through the rules (it’s on the website or you can get a copy from the front desk). If there is something there you don’t agree with, please bring that to our attention. We can work on any change and improvement. But remember...

## What's So Invasive about Invasive Species? Part Two

Welcome back! Last month we determined that invasive species are species of plants, animals, or insects that are not native to a particular habitat and are likely to cause harm on an environmental or economic level. Just because an invasive species moves into an area does not mean a natural community is immediately negatively impacted; however, we did examine the introduction and establishment of one invasive species common to Michigan, Garlic Mustard (*Allaria petiolata*), and how that one plant can alter an entire ecosystem.

I have selected two invasive species that are established at Lost Lake Woods Club for us to explore in detail. Each has impacted the club in different ways and is easy to recognize once you know what you are looking for.

**Common Reed (*Phragmites australis*):** Commonly referred to by its Latin genus, Phragmites, most of us recognize this as the tall grass growing in ditches and along road easements throughout Michigan. If you are from Southeast Michigan you have most likely observed how this grass has aggressively spread over the last twenty years. There are native species of Phragmites in the Great Lakes Region, but this particular species moved in and has been successfully outcompeting native plants for decades. One piece of rhizome (a type of underground, rooting stem) that is transported from one area to another on a piece of mowing equipment can grow up to 60 feet long in one season. This long root then becomes the parent of other root shoots that support the vertical growth of grass stems. Phragmites secretes biochemicals into the surrounding environment that prohibit the growth of native species. This is called the alleopathy of a species. This mechanism is why you always see Phragmites growing in what sometimes looks like an endless field of grass. This can also be referred to as a monoculture because only one (*mono*) type of species is growing there. As Phragmites spreads it impacts the native seed bed and can have detrimental impacts on native aquatic species (plant, animal, and insect) by removing sources of light, shelter, and food. It will also impact available forage for waterfowl. With a treatment and monitoring plan, Phragmites can be treated and eradicated.

**Emerald Ash Borer (*Agrilus planipennis Fairmaire*)** was discovered in Southeast Michigan in 2002. In the last eleven years it has claimed over 30 million ash trees in Southeast Michigan. Close your eyes and envision yourself standing in the woods. Start counting the trees around you. How much area did you have to envision just counting to 100? Now multiply those 100 trees by 300,000. That is just in one area of the state. Wow is right. This single insect has the potential to kill 700 million ash trees in Michigan alone. I can't even picture 700 million trees in my mind but the number alone feels like a punch in the gut. The Emerald Ash Borer comes to us from Asia and was most likely brought over in a shipment of imported goods. Lost Lake Woods has been heavily hit in the last few years by this insect and the impacts can be seen on the golf course, throughout the subdivision, and through the Woods Gate. If you have found

yourself standing near a tree that is riddled with D shaped holes and the bark is flaking off, you are probably looking at the work of the ash borer. There are many trees on the property where the bark has flaked off to reveal the intricate carvings (called galleries) that the larvae have made as it has eaten its way through the softwood. The mature borer is the indirect cause of the Ash tree's mortality; the direct cause of death is due to the adult insect depositing its larvae on the tree.

It is commonly thought that trees have only two layers – the bark and the wood it covers. There are in fact five layers to a tree, two of which are the tree's primary transport system for water and nutrients. Underneath the bark is the inner bark, or phloem. This layer is in charge of nutrients. The third layer is



called the cambium. This layer is what forms the annual tree rings that you use to age a tree. The fourth layer is called the sapwood layer and is really an intermediate layer that builds up two other layers. Sapwood becomes new cambium that transports water to the leaves. The innermost layer is called the heartwood. This is composed of old layers of sapwood that have died. The largest and thickest portion of the tree, the

heartwood, depends on the thinner outer layers to stay healthy and intact. The adult ash borer deposits eggs in crevices within the bark. When the eggs hatch, the larvae bore their way into the phloem and cambium then tunnel their way through the soft and delicious wood. Over time this impacts the tree's ability to transport vital nutrients and water. Then the tree dies. This would be true for any tree whose inner layers were invaded; the devastation to Michigan's forests is that this insect prefers only Ash trees (*Fraxinus* species). This reduces the biodiversity of our forests by eradicating a native species. Research has found that forest stands with more Ash are less impacted than individual trees, such as those found on the golf course or in the subdivision. Here at Lost Lake Woods, only time and genetics will determine whether our Ash trees will once reach into the forest canopy again.

We have now come full circle back to gloom and doom again; sorry about that. The loss of Michigan's Ash trees will not be the downfall of our forests. We grow good trees here and we grow them well! Some Ash trees are showing a resistance to the borer and researchers are working on developing chemical and biological controls to combat this insect. It is the bigger picture of how invasive species change our landscape that we need to focus on. We possess the power to control our actions and how we manage our behaviors; the underlying theme in the establishment of invasive species anywhere in the world is that someone just didn't stop to think what the ramifications of their actions would be. Next time you are purchasing a plant for your landscaping consider inquiring if it is native to Michigan. Educate yourself on what is growing in your backyard. Are those pretty flowers in your field Dame's Rocket? What about the tall, purple flowers growing in the wetland next door? Could they be Purple Loosestrife? If one plant, animal, or insect can drastically impact its surroundings we can work together to impact that plant or insect. The lands at Lost Lake Woods provide us with a lifetime of enjoyment and outdoor adventure. We can give back to those lands simply by knowing what is out there
