Both of the membership proposals that were on the ballot, the Legacy Membership and Extended Family Privileges, passed with large majorities and both programs have started off with a bang. Within days of their passing we've had four people sign up, two for each program. That was without any advertising or public notification. I would say that these programs are off to a great start, and I can see continued success as we grow our membership ranks with these young enthusiastic new members.

Manager's Minute

I'm writing just a few days into rifle season. The first few days were unseasonably warm and we even had some light rain, but we still took some nice bucks out of the woods. Roughly 250 hunters went through the various gates on opening day and most (~220) went back on day two. We did see quite a drop-off for day three though (~80). As I write, we've taken 45 antlered and 60 antlerless during all seasons to date, approximately 30 of each in the first few days of rifle season. I think the largest to date has been a 185 pound 10 point buck. There were at least two other that exceeded 150 lbs., but one had a broken rack. Most hunters reported seeing deer, especially the first day. The rut is late to start this year, so hopefully there is still good hunting yet to come.

Hunter's Round-Up was well attended (~110) and the Buck Pole had a strong showing again this year. What if my child is married or has children?

April 3, 1925—November 2, 2013



Dick was born on April 3rd, 1925, the son of John and Frances. He grew up with his brother Joe and sister Winifred in Manistee, Michigan. He was Valedictorian and 1943 Class President at Manistee High School, later receiving his MBA from the University of Michigan in August of 1950.

Dick served on the boards of the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club, Lost Lake Woods Club, Cranbrook Board of Trustees and CCS Board of Trustees, as well as being a former member of the Bloomfield Hills Country Club.

Are you the child/grandchild of an existing Lost Lake Woods Club and want to enjoy all that Lost Lake Woods Club has to offer, but not yet ready to become a Full Member?

Under our Legacy Membership Program you can!

Who is eligible?

Legacy Memberships are available to all children or grandchildren of existing members in good standing who co-sign the Legacy Member's financial member account until such time that the Legacy Membership is converted to full membership. The Legacy Membership must be approved before the applicant attains the age of 35.

What are the benefits of the Legacy Membership Program?

Under our Legacy Membership Program, an existing member's child or grandchild will enjoy all the privileges of a Full Membership in good standing: use of all facilities of the Association, which are not limited to, but are inclusive of Club-house, lands, lakes, recreational facilities, camping grounds and other physical attributes of the Association **(including hunting)** subject to such Rules and Regulations as established by the Board of Directors. All privileges are available to the Legacy Member except that of vote. Legacy Members will be issued their own dues number. Legacy Members possess no equity ownership in the Club. Lot purchase is not a requirement of the Legacy Membership Program.

Can more than one Legacy Family Member take advantage of this opportunity?

Absolutely! Any child/grandchild of an existing member in good standing may participate in this program; however a separate fee will be calculated for each participating Legacy Member. Only one Legacy Membership is granted to a Legacy Membership applicant.

What if the Legacy Member is married or has children?

While on this program, the Legacy Member's spouse, and all children, will enjoy "immediate family" status as defined in Article 1, Section 4 of the Lost Lake Woods Association By-Laws.

How long may the Legacy Member continue in the Program?

The Legacy Membership approved applicant shall have five (5) years from application approval, or until said applicant's 35th birthday, whichever is longer, to purchase a Membership Lot and become a Full Member as described in Article 1, Section 1 of the Lost Lake Woods Association By-Laws.

What are the Costs associated with the Legacy Membership Program?

Initially, a non-refundable application fee of five hundred dollars (\$500) is required (amount set by the Board of Directors), however should the Legacy Member transfer to a Full Membership status, the Legacy Member will receive a **Lot Purchase Credit*** (see below) to be used toward non-dues charges.

Legacy Members shall also pay annual dues as follows:

- Year 1 of Membership (until December 31st of the initial year): fifty percent (50%) of annual dues less the dining room and lodge minimum.
- Year 2 of Membership (beginning January 1 of the first full year in the Legacy Program): seventy-five percent (75%) of annual dues less the dining room and lodge minimum.

Introducing: Family Legacy Program

How is the Legacy Membership Program billed?

Legacy Members may be billed monthly, quarterly, semi-annually or annually.

How does the Legacy Member Qualify?

The Legacy Member applicant must prove minimum income upon application (prior year tax returns). That minimum income amount is determined for that fiscal year by the Board of Directors and is reviewed from time to time and is adjusted as needed (please contact the office for current minimum income structure).
The Legacy Member applicant must have a sponsoring parent or grandparent who is an existing Member in good standing. This sponsoring parent/grandparent of the Legacy Member must act as co-signer on the account of the Legacy Member. The sponsoring parent/grandparent shall guarantee payment of any late or outstanding debts incurred and not paid according to Article 1, Section 12, by the Legacy Member.

The Legacy Member must also obtain sponsor and co-sponsors.

What is a "Lot Purchase Credit*?"

If the Legacy Member transfers to a Full Membership status, said Legacy Member shall receive a Lot Purchase credit as follows:

- a. If the Legacy Member purchases a lot in the first year that they are in the Legacy Membership Program, a three hundred dollar (\$300) credit will be applied to their account to be used for any charges except dues.
- b. If the Legacy Member purchases a lot in the second year that they are in the Legacy Membership Program, a two hundred dollar (\$200) credit will be applied to their account to be used for any charges except dues.
- c. If the Legacy Member purchases a lot in the third year that they are in the Legacy Membership Program, a one hundred dollar (\$100) credit will be applied to their account to be used for any charges except dues.

What happens if the Legacy Membership is not maintained?

If the Legacy Membership account becomes delinquent, the balance owing on said Legacy Member's account shall be billed on the sponsoring parent or grandparent account.

What happens if I don't want to continue with the program?

Legacy Members may revoke participation in the Legacy Membership Program at any time without penalty; however dues paid are not refundable once applied. Revocation must be submitted in writing.

What happens if my sponsoring parent/grandparent is no longer a Lost Lake Woods Club Member?

If your sponsoring parent/grandparent is no longer a Lost Lake Woods Club Member for any reason, the Legacy Member shall have three (3) months to become a full Member or their Legacy Membership will automatically be terminated.
