- To receive a current year tag, the member must present a filled out GPS reporting form stating the GPS coordinates of their blind, a valid firearm deer license and photo identification (if asked) to staff in the lodge.
- The coordinates should be in the following format: N xx deg.XX.xxx min. W XXX deb. XX.xxx min.

Your LLWC Future Planning Committee (FPC) initiated work on a five year Technology Plan in early 2012. The purpose of the Plan is to evaluate and identify the technology needs of our club and determine what approach's may be best to meet certain objectives that include but are not limited to;

- Determine what revenue generating opportunities there are available using different approaches to technological infrastructure models,
- Meet the needs of the club that relate to attracting new members through the use of various media that may lead LLWC to become a destination property,

The five year plan incorporates the years 2013 through 2017. We are looking forward to direct contact with members and management through small group and one on one meeting's to uncover what makes sense for the club.

President's POV (Point of View)

"Membership has its privileges"

The statement above was made famous in an extremely successful advertising campaign by American Express during the late 80's and early 90's. The feeling that was conveyed was that you could be part of an elite group and you were special to belong to this group. Being a member meant there were special benefits and perks reserved only for you that went with your membership.

We are much the same way with our membership. Even though we allow our guests to enjoy many of the activities offered at our club, our guests pay a higher price for their lack of membership. Or in the case of certain hunting and fishing rights, these benefits are unavailable to non-members, and are available only as a benefit of membership.

From time to time ideas have been put forth to the Board to allow guests to partake in these exclusive membership perks. During one of my very first Board meetings as a Director, a "newer" member to our club stood and made the suggestion that we allow his guests to deer hunt so that he could show him how good our hunting is, and by allowing guests to hunt, it could potentially bring in new members.

The silence from the room was deafening. Had it not been for a couple of level headed members in the crowd that day, I believe this new member would have been marched to the rifle range and asked to hold targets while members sighted in their rifles. tion, and the meeting moved on to other, saner, subjects.

The point here is that we are always looking for ways to bring in new members, and that's good. But how do you strike a balance between exclusivity and a "test drive?" Would you buy a car without driving it first? How about trying on a pair of shoes before buying (unless you're my daughter and you buy them because they are "cute" whether they fit or not)? So the question is, how do we convince potential members to take the plunge and join LLWC, if they cannot experience all we have to offer? In my opinion, LLWC is a hunt club first, and everything else is second. I know some of you may argue that point, but if I were praying for warmer weather and I'll hope to see you all soon! to agree with another opinion, then we'd both be wrong (I'm only kidding, I would never agree with another opinion). Anyway, I digress. If LLWC is a hunt club first, how do we entice families to join a hunt club that they have never hunted?

This is where you come in. When speaking with non-members about our club, you need to really talk up our hunting and fishing. It's not hard since we have great hunting and fishing. Talk about our food plot program and timber harvests that improve habitat. Speak highly of the efforts of our biologist and the Conservation Committee. Tell them about the fish planting programs and the turkey feeding. Show pictures of the wildlife and take your guests in the woods. Not just a drive along the trails, but get out of the truck and throw on your boots, take a pack with your lunch, and go for a long hike. Show them what we have to offer in the way of habitat. Explain our safety record and our antierless harvest program and explain why we harvest

Thru The Green

It looks like the golf season will finally get here, but it has been a long time coming. I finally had an opportunity to get a look at some of the turf on the course. Old man winter has left his impression on the golf course, along with the voles and the deer.

The turf on the greens is in good condition at this point, with minor damage from snowmold fungus, the tees and fairways are in worse condition sustaining damage from snowmold, voles (which are small rodents that chew off the grass plant at ground level and the deer pulling up grass plant when they eat. Some of this damage will grow back on it's own as the temperatures increase, however the remaining damage will need to be seeded to completely recover. The length of recovery time will depend on the spring temperatures, hopefully they will increase dramatically in the coming weeks. Some warm rains would also help. We were lucky in one respect, that there is not the damage from ice like they received down state.

Clean up of all the debris that fell during the winter will begin as soon as the snow is gone and the turf is dry enough to allow maintenance vehicles to move about the course. Tree limbs and leaves make up the bulk of this debris. The cart paths will need to have some holes filled and be graded to level them back out.

Drainage is important this time of year to get the water off the course as quickly as possible. I'm very happy with the new drain tile that was installed last season, it is working quite well this spring. The areas where these tiles were installed are some of the driest on the course.

I believe that once the weather breaks this spring the golf maintenance staff will be going non stop to get the course into good playing condition and maybe Mother Nature will give us some help along the way. See you on the course!
