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The following Lost Lake Woods Association Rules and Regulations were changed at the April 22, 2014 Board Meeting:

The date as to when deer hunting ground blinds must be tagged with a current year tag per the following rule revisions:

1. Members must tag their existing blind by the end of the first weekend of September.
2. All remaining members wishing to build a new blind or tag an abandoned blind must do so by October 15 (Exception: new members approved at the October BOD meeting or at the discretion of the manager).
3. No tags will be issued after October 15 (Exception: new members approved at the October BOD meeting or at the discretion of the manager).
4. To receive a current year tag, the member must present a filled out GPS reporting form stating the GPS coordinates of their blind, a valid firearm deer license and photo identification (if asked) to staff in the lodge.
5. The coordinates should be in the following format: N xx deg.XX.xxx min. W XXX deb. XX.xxx min.

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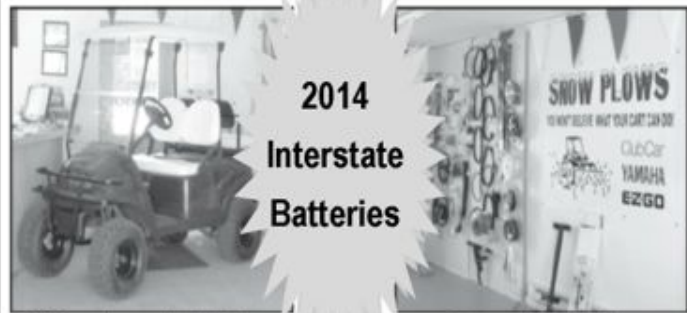

Your LLWC Future Planning Committee (FPC) initiated work on a five year Technology Plan in early 2012. The purpose of the Plan is to evaluate and identify the technology needs of our club and determine what approach’s may be best to meet certain objectives that include but are not limited to;

“Membership has its privileges”

The statement above was made famous in an extremely successful advertising campaign by American Express during the late 80’s and early 90’s. The feeling that was conveyed was that you could be part of an elite group and you were special to belong to this group. Being a member meant there were special benefits and perks reserved only for you that went with your membership.

We are much the same way with our membership. Even though we allow our guests to enjoy many of the activities offered at our club, our guests pay a higher price for their lack of membership. Or in the case of certain hunting and fishing rights, these benefits are unavailable to non-members, and are available only as a benefit of membership.

Luckily for him, the member was politely thanked for his suggestion, and the meeting moved on to other, saner, subjects.

The point here is that we are always looking for ways to bring in new members, and that’s good. But how do you strike a balance between exclusivity and a “test drive?” Would you buy a car without driving it first? How about trying on a pair of shoes before buying (unless you’re my daughter and you buy them because they are “cute” whether they fit or not)? So the question is, how do we convince potential members to take the plunge and join LLWC, if they cannot experience all we have to offer?

In my opinion, LLWC is a hunt club first, and everything else is second. Autumn Olive Management and Control—Conservation

The great logging era of the late 1800’s and early 1900’s left most of the land in the Northern Lower and Upper Peninsulas of Michigan barren. The mature pine forests were suddenly gone, drastically impacting how birds and animals utilized the land. As Michigan’s residents recovered from the tumultuous years of war and depression, the concept of managing game species and creating desirable habitat at the landscape level became a practice. Landowners began planting herbaceous plants, shrubs, and trees that attracted the wildlife they wanted to view or hunt. At the time, not much thought was given to whether a species was native or what future impacts certain species would have on the landscape. It is worth noting that although the impact of non-native species had not been considered here, non-native plants and animals had already been introduced to multiple environments in countries around the globe. The results of some of these introductions were devastating. This also includes newer colonies such as Australia. Some of these impacts had been documented; we just either weren’t aware or didn’t listen.

Land management agencies developed programs to assist landowners in meeting these new habitat creation and management goals. They also introduced new, non-native species on public lands for the purpose of creating new food and cover sources for wildlife. One of the most widespread species that was distributed in Michigan is called Autumn Olive (*Elaeagnus umbellata*).

Autumn Olive is a medium sized shrub or small tree that can grow to about 20 feet in height and will grow to 30 feet in width given the right conditions. The fruit of this tree is eaten by a variety of birds and animals. Due to the specie’s ability to grow in poor soils with little nutrients, Autumn Olive grows quickly in areas that have been disturbed by

logging, ranching, or other activities that disturb the soil and create openings in the forest. The birds and animals that eat the fruit distribute the seeds throughout the forest through their feces. Autumn Olive is widely distributed here at Lost Lake Woods Club.

You don’t need to leave your vehicle to see where Autumn Olive grows here on the club. In some areas it lines the road or trail. It is easily identified by its shrubby growth and leaves that are green on top but silvery underneath. The leaves emerge early in the spring; earlier than most of the other species in the woods which makes identification for treatment easy. The branches are heavy with small red berries in the fall.

The Conservation Committee will be starting a new management and control plan this year to reduce the areas of Autumn Olive at Lost Lake Woods Club. When a population is this established, chemical control is the best option for removal. Chemical treatments, properly applied, pose very little threat to the surrounding environment. As with any type of management, correct timing to reduce impact to sensitive species such as wildflowers or amphibian mating cycles will be addressed.

One of the objectives of removing the Autumn Olive is to create more wildlife openings on the club. An opening is not a managed food plot, but an area of native grasses and shrubs that provide food and nesting cover for wildlife. Wildlife openings are valuable for ground nesting birds, such as Wild Turkeys, and provide excellent cover for fawns. Stay tuned for updates as this new project begins this spring!

Thru The Green

It looks like the golf season will finally get here, but it has been a long time coming. I finally had an opportunity to get a look at some of the turf on the course. Old man winter has left his impression on the golf course, along with the voles and the deer.

The turf on the greens is in good condition at this point, with minor damage from snowmold fungus, the tees and fairways are in worse condition sustaining damage from snowmold, voles (which are small rodents that chew off the grass plant at ground level and the deer pulling up grass plant when they eat. Some of this damage will grow back on it's own as the temperatures increase, however the remaining damage will need to be seeded to completely recover. The length of recovery time will depend on the spring temperatures, hopefully they will increase dramatically in the coming weeks. Some warm rains would also help. We were lucky in one respect, that there is not the damage from ice like they received down state.

Clean up of all the debris that fell during the winter will begin as soon as the snow is gone and the turf is dry enough to allow maintenance vehicles to move about the course. Tree limbs and leaves make up the bulk of this debris. The cart paths will need to have some holes filled and be graded to level them back out.

Drainage is important this time of year to get the water off the course as quickly as possible. I'm very happy with the new drain tile that was installed last season, it is working quite well this spring. The areas where these tiles were installed are some of the driest on the course.

I believe that once the weather breaks this spring the golf maintenance staff will be going non stop to get the course into good playing condition and maybe Mother Nature will give us some help along the way. See you on the course!

Did you know that all ORV operators under 16 years old are required to possess a valid safety training certificate when operating an ORV?

To obtain a safety certificate, the operator must take an ORV safety education course (see below) and pass the certification exam. The operator must carry the safety certificate on his or her person and present it upon demand of a law enforcement officer if on public lands.
