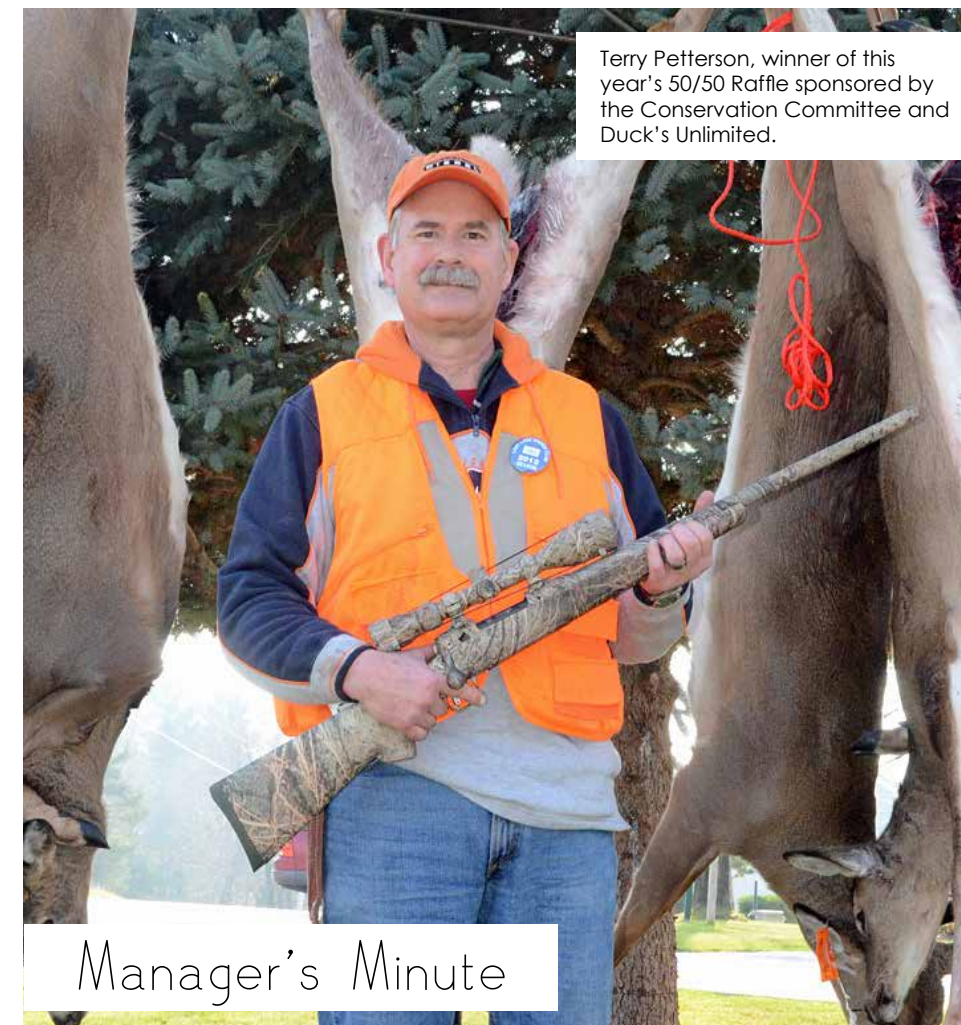

Rules & Regulations Change

Effective November 10, 2012

Fires and Fire Permits

1. **Campfires are allowed in proper fire containers.** Fires must be attended **by an adult** at all times and properly extinguished. **Safe campfire practices should be followed at all times.**

2. Fire containers on transient sites at the campground must be commercially manufactured and a minimum of 15 inches above ground level.

3. Fire containers on privately owned lots within the subdivision must be approved by the Manager and:

a. Either commercially manufactured and a minimum of 15 inches above ground level;

b. Or made of rings of metal or stone, 15 inches deep and a maximum of 36 inches in diameter.

c. **Fire containers should be placed at least 10 feet away from logs, stumps and forest debris that may catch fire.**

Refer to the campground rule section for rules governing campground fires.

4. **Campfires should not exceed three feet in height and must be maintained within the fire container.**

5. The Club's compost dump is available for the disposal of leaves and other natural debris and, as

such, the burning of leaves and other natural debris in the subdivision is prohibited. The exception would be an approved campfire as defined in rule #3.

6. Permits must be obtained at the Lodge to start fires at the Deer Lake service area and the Bear Lake service area.

7. For safety reasons, the Manager **and the Board** has the authority to prohibit all fires during dry periods. **The**

Club may be more restrictive than the State and local fire officials. Notice will be posted at the main gate and the Lodge.

This past year, the Walk presented seven Greenbush gardens and two years ago, ten gardens were shown in the City of Harrisville. 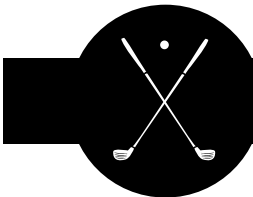

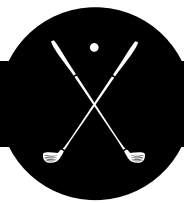

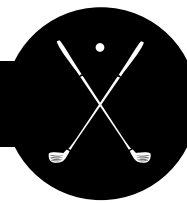

Feeding Turkeys in Winter: The Experiment Continues

You may have noticed an odd looking contraption behind the skeet range this summer. The Conservation Committee, in an effort to come up with a way to feed turkeys in winter while keeping the deer away, constructed a feeder using a series of pipes over a two foot deep hole. This is called a cattle guard. It's used to allow trucks and equipment to pass through an enclosure without having a gate. The idea is that the turkeys will pass over the tubes while the deer will find out that this is unstable footing and will not attempt to cross it to get to the corn.

After testing the feeder, we've concluded that this will keep the deer out of the feeder but will the turkeys use it? We've located the feeder to its new spot by Peterson's Swamp. This area is a wintering home for a substantial amount of birds and deer. We've placed corn in the feeder and have trail cams set up to monitor any activity. We're excited to see if this idea will be a success.

We have not been feeding the turkeys during the winter for the past few years. If the downturn in the turkey population at the club is a result of this or it is just Mother Nature telling us something, we don't know. We would like to know of any turkey flock sightings and the area that they were seen to aid in identifying new potential feeder sites in the future. There will be turkey observation cards available at the desk. Your help will be truly appreciated.



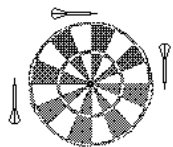
